Course Overview:

The current threat of terrorism in the United Kingdom can involve the exploitation of vulnerable individuals, including children, young people and vulnerable adults.

Our Prevent - Safeguarding Awareness for Homeless Organisations training course, is designed to assist staff gain a comprehensive understanding of the various factors that may influence an individual towards violent extremism. We explore the possible indicators of radicalisation and extremist behaviour; the rhetoric, images, flags/symbols, interests, associations and possible items of concern that staff may encounter when engaging with students.

Through consultation with clients, we discuss internal safeguarding procedures and subsequent reporting actions.

Trainer:

Vince Donovan retired from South Wales Police in September 2014, having served the last six years of his thirty year police career as a Prevent Engagement officer. Vince gained considerable experience engaging with a significant number of vulnerable individuals, including working closely with the families of those involved in terrorist campaigns and others whose sons had travelled to join terrorist groups in Kenya (Al-Shabaab) and Syria (ISIS).

During Vince's service as a Prevent Engagement officer, he worked closely with statutory partners in South Wales, including Local Authorities, Health Service, Probation and Education (H.E. and F.E.) and on behalf of South Wales Police led on the design and delivery of bespoke Prevent training (including WRAP - Workshops to Raise Awareness of Prevent) to staff within the police service, statutory and external partners alike.

Since retirement, Vince regularly provides interviews on all aspects of terrorism on behalf of the BBC.
